

Carson Valley Men's Club

General Information

The Carson Valley Men's Club conducts golf tournament events for the season beginning in March and ending in November each year. The Club is affiliated with the Northern Nevada Golf Association and the Carson Valley Golf Course. Membership is required to participate in tournament events, and members shall establish a Handicap Index under the World Handicap System. All tournaments are conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf and Local Golf Course Rules established/approved by the Men's Club Board of Directors.

Tees- All Carson Valley Men's Club events are played from the Preferred Tees as selected by each member on the Men's Club application form. Exceptions:

- Team Events posted as "White Tee" including scramble, shamble or best ball.
- Any player may choose to play from a tee box other than Preferred Tee if the player annotates the actual tee played on score card.

Play from either the preferred tees or alternate tees chosen by the player will be subject to World Handicap System reduction based on the current Course Handicap.

Score Cards- All tournament score cards will be signed by a scorer and attester. Cards will be turned in at the end of the round. Missing signatures or cards will result in player disqualification.

Skins- Buy-in's \$5.00 Gross and/or \$5.00 Net. Net = Handicap used is 75% of course handicap.

KP- Buy-in \$5.00 split between two par 3 holes determined by Tournament Director for each event.

Posting Scores- All club members are required to post all golf scores on GHIN in accordance with the World Handicap System. Gross scores are to be posted for all Northern Nevada courses played within the NNGA active season, March to November. Posting can be hole by hole, nine holes or 18 holes. GHIN will adjust each player's handicap index as each score is posted. For Men's Club Tournaments, the Tournament Director will post each participant's score to GHIN for each Tournament played.

Score posting is required in all forms of competition. This includes match play, multi-ball and team competitions in which the player plays his own ball.

Peer Review- Peer review may be directed by the Board to gain an understanding of a player's potential/ability and to form a reasonable basis for supporting or disputing a score that has been posted. The two essentials of peer review are:

- Members must have a reasonable and regular opportunity to play together
- Access must be provided to **complete** scoring records.

Members who fail to post their scores in a timely manner will be subject to a Peer Review and potentially having penalty scores posted for them or their handicap index adjusted.

With the concurrence of the Board, the Handicap Chairman shall adjust or withdraw the handicap index of a player who manipulates scores.

Some examples are:

- Repeatedly playing more than one ball to avoid posting
- Posting erroneous scores
- Deliberately inflating a score
- Deliberately posting more or fewer strokes than actually played
